1 AN ACT TO PROVIDE NO-EXCUSE ABSENTEE VOTING FOR ANY QUALIFIED VOTER WHO VOTES ABSENTEE IN PERSON AT THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR DURING CALENDAR YEAR 2020; TO PROVIDE THAT ALL ABSENTEE VOTES CAST 4 IN PERSON AT THE OFFICE OF THE REGISTRAR SHALL BE CAST ON EITHER A 5 DIRECT RECORDING ELECTRONIC VOTING SYSTEM OR USING AN OPTICAL MARK READING EQUIPMENT MACHINE UNLESS THE REGISTRAR DETERMINES THAT THOSE METHODS WOULD BE TOO EXPENSIVE OR INEFFICIENT, IN WHICH CASE 7 8 ABSENTEE PAPER BALLOTS MAY BE USED; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. (1) At any election that occurs in calendar year 10 2020, a qualified voter may vote in person by an absentee ballot 11 for any reason. A qualified voter who votes in person by an 12 absentee ballot shall not be required to complete an absentee 13 ballot application before casting his or her absentee ballot. 14 These provisions shall not apply to absentee ballots received by 15 16 mail. (b) If the registrar of any county determines that conducting absentee voting in the office of the registrar as provided in subsection (1) of this section with either a direct recording electronic voting system or with an official ballot that is fed through an optical mark reading equipment machine will be too expensive or inefficient, that registrar may choose to conduct the absentee voting in the office of the registrar with absentee paper ballots that shall be voted and placed inside the official envelop provided by the registrar and then deposited into the sealed ballot box not later than 5:00 p.m. on the Saturday immediately preceding elections held on Tuesday, the Thursday immediately preceding elections held on Saturday, or the second day immediately preceding the date of elections held on other
